# 4. Reports of Executive Officers:

a) Treasurer's Report- Financials for 2024 Keith presented and reviewed the 2024 Financials Total Income - \$14,751.74 Total Expenses - \$13,816.78 Copy of complete statement – attached

# b) Vice President's Report:

<u>Membership:</u> currently at about 800 members which is normal for this time of year. Should finish the year with about 1000 registered members; many more get our newsletter.

<u>Activities</u> – going well and some new ones added in the last year – Social Dance, Wood Carving. Lawn Bowling. Novice Pickleball

<u>No longer available</u> – Trail Hikers (Thursdays), Carpet Bowling, Golf

<u>Administration</u> - majority of Jim's time is taken up with many aspects of administration – average of 15 hours per week. More assistance is needed. Complete written report is attached to the minutes.

# 5. Reports of Directors:

a) Doug Williams – Pancake Breakfasts/Wagon:

We have three park pancake/picnic activities scheduled this spring / summer. Pancake wagon has reached the end of its usefulness – getting very shabby. Hope we can squeeze one more year from it.

Doug is actively looking at cost and quotes for replacing it. Local trailer shop could build us a new one for \$17,000. We need to explore other options or look for a second hand one before making a decision.

Discussion around relocating the picnic to a site that has existing cooking facilities – QB Legion, Curling Rink. A plan will be formalized and presented to members before proceeding with a purchase or relocating. This year's outdoor activities will be status quo at the park.

b) Rodney Arnold – Community Park: Rodney is the liaison to the City for booking the picnic shelter and dealing with Island Health when we cook food. Process of PGOSA using the park has become much more bureaucratic over the last 2-3 years.

Remembrance Day Services: Rodney also liaises with the three local Legions for their Service and PGOSA presenting a wreathe at the service.

c) David White – new Director – no report

#### 6. New Business:

- Volunteers to assist with Arrowsmith Lodge project the local care home has asked for cyclists to volunteer to ride their buggy-trike transporting two residents through neighboring streets. A ride of about 30 minutes would give the residents an outdoor adventure. This has been turned over to the cycling groups and hopefully volunteers will come forward.
- Administrative Help Needed: As mentioned in Jim's report more help is needed on the PGOSA Board. We can have up to 10 on the Board – splitting the load between more members would be ideal.
- Social Events currently just the spring/summer events in the park are the only true social events happening. Social Committee has gone in various directions and another one needs to be established so a couple fall/winter socials can happen.
- Other Items: Director Doug brought up the topic of donations to our Oceanside Urgent Care facility to help with their campaign to raise money to

purchase 35 new screening monitors for our facility, each at a cost of \$7000. This is a community campaign through the Nanaimo District Hospital Foundation. Lots of discussion around whether giving to community groups is a function of our organization, or if we should we put it out to our members to contribute themselves if interested in supporting this initiative.

**Motion:** Moved - Cheryl McIntosh Seconded – (Jim ) We highlight the need and request from Oceanside Urgent Care that they have a campaign to raise funds for 35 new screening monitors at \$7000 each. Members can contribute themselves if interested.

Motion: Passed

# Report by Vice President - Jim Powell

# **Membership Report:**

Membership the last few years has been somewhat stable – up a little from COVID times and still a healthy number of over 1000 members.

2020 - 925 members 2021 - 915 members 2022 - 1040 members

2023 - 1030 members 2024 - 1035 members 2025 – approximately 800

members at this time

Online membership applications – about 50%

#### **Activities:**

- The number of activities has grown a little during the past year:

- Social Dance Sunday afternoons led by member of the senior center in Qualicum Beach
- Line Dancing Tuesday mornings and has become quite popular
- Novice Pickleball Friday evenings during the winter and early spring
- Wood carving Friday mornings at Qualicum Elem. Shop
- Games Mahjong has become quite popular and numbers are growing
- Possible new Activity Badminton Open to others but someone has to come forward to lead it or be the Activity Manager

# No Longer Happening:

- Carpet Bowling Qualicum Civic Center
- Trail Hikers on Thursdays
- Regular Golf during the spring/summer months

#### Administration:

Most of my time is taken up with ongoing administration – planning, organizing, communicating through emails and our newsletter, and executing activities, and dealing with issues that might arise. Be thankful you have had five Board members who give freely of their time to make PGOSA activities and events happen.

Also, many thanks to the ACTIVITY MANAGERS who lead everything and take care of all the details involved in coordinating activities.

Social dynamics in our organization has changed immensely over the last five to ten years. Many members who were very involved with PGOSA five or more years ago have either passed on or at an age where their involvement is very limited. The number

of social activities has declined and it is a struggle to ger members learning the activity and then taking it on ....not helping once and then dropping their involvement.

We desperately need more members to take on leadership positions – either on the Board or taking on the chair of a committee – e.g. – membership, social activities. Currently I am trying to keep as many events going as possible, but more assistance is needed. I also manage two activities curling and games which keeps me more than busy. More help is needed.
